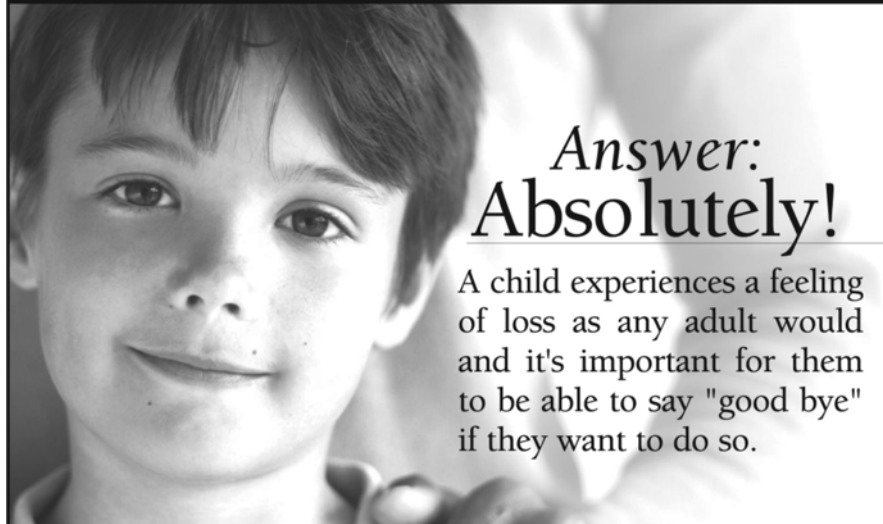

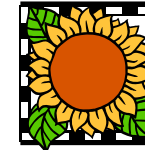

What a life well lived!

As an older sister, I knew her from her birth to her last breath, on June 6, 2008.

Even though she was much younger, she has always been a model and teacher to me. I admired her for so many qualities, her self-discipline, intelligence, good judgement, courage, honesty, integrity, reliability, trustworthiness, tolerance and patience, generosity, humbleness, but most of all, for her ability to love unconditionally.

Dorothea was a true giver: she gave beautiful smiles, her time and energy to help people and charities, thoughtful cards and generous presents for all occasions. She was very selfless and what mattered to her most was to love and to serve humankind.

We, who attended her good-bye party on June 1, 2008, witnessed the energy she had for people. Although, due to kidney failure, she could not stay awake more than fifteen minutes since she came out of the hospital, on June 1 she was alert and awake for more than eight hours. Who can forget that final speech of hers teaching us not to fear death?

I feel deeply saddened that she left us at such a young age and I will always miss her.

Dorothea was born after my other younger sister died in a tragic accident. My parents gave her the name Dorothea Renate, meaning the "reborn gift of God". To me Dorothea was the reborn gift of God for which I am very thankful.

**The King Family and Second Story Treasures Thrift Store Volunteers Support the 8<sup>th</sup> Annual Journey Walk/Run for Remembrance**

The King family joined forces with volunteers from Second Story Treasures Hospice Thrift Store to participate in the 8<sup>th</sup> Annual Journey Walk/Run for Remembrance held on June 8, 2008. They collected pledges and walked in memory of Dan King who passed away four months ago. Dan's widow Joyce has volunteered several days a week at the Hospice Thrift Store for the past five years.

Over \$15,000 was raised and out of that amount, over \$4,600 was raised by three teams of thrift store volunteers and the King family team. This contribution enables Langley Hospice to offer palliative and bereavement support programs free of charge to the community. That is indeed a wonderful tribute to Dan King.

Joyce remarks "It's another way for the family to express their devotion to Dan, to do something in memory of their dad and their grandpa". "It was a good exercise for us to work through our grief".

Joyce also acknowledges the compassionate support she received from the thrift store volunteers and was anxious to get back to her volunteer work. Diane Boyd, thrift store manager provides leadership to 75 volunteers who are responsible for the success of the store. Second Story Treasures is an important community endeavor and is a significant fundraising source for the Society, contributing over 32% of the net revenue.

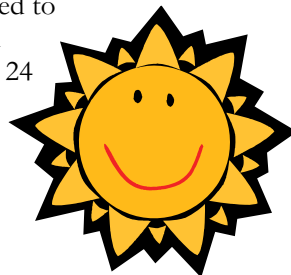

## Condensed Hospice Training at Second Story Treasures

Many of the customers and donors that visit Second Story Treasures have a story to share about a death that they have experienced. Sometimes, it is a fellow volunteer that has experienced a loss. And



sometimes, they may get emotional. The goal of the Condensed Hospice Training is to empower the volunteers with the tools to be a positive support for those who are grieving.



Four three-hour sessions of this condensed version of Langley Hospice's Basic Hospice Training was held at Second Story Treasures through the months of May



and June for the store volunteers. It was facilitated by Fernande Ouellette and Adrienne Wong, and they are working on setting up more training sessions. The training received positive and encouraging feedback:

- ◆ "Very useful...Certainly needed a refresher to remind me and reinforce listening skills, nonjudgmental practices, pitfalls, boundaries etc."
- ◆ "It gave me a better understanding of the importance of listening to a person who is suffering and not pushing my thoughts on them of what I may have experienced."
- ◆ "Very helpful - both for use with strangers in the shop as well as with friends and family."
