Langley Hospice Society, a community-based, non-profit organization, provides compassionate support to help people live with dignity and hope while coping with grief and the end of life.

Presidents' and Executive Director's Report

Since 1983, Langley Hospice has provided compassionate care for clients and their families facing the challenges of advanced illness, death and bereavement. Reflecting on this past year, change has been a constant theme for the British Columbia hospice palliative care environment. Responding to significant change is both a challenge and a gift – providing the opportunity to do things better.

The fiscal year started off with Sandra's return from an intensive, multi-disciplinary and multicultural seminar entitled **2006 Hospice & Palliative Care Study Seminar in Britain**. This leading international event included 40 people from over 20 countries and provided a wonderful opportunity to share ideas, learn from each other, and celebrate successes. This trip was truly inspirational and is setting the stage for Langley Hospice to play a big role in filling the gaps that the medical system can't fill, i.e. activity/wellness center, education, bereavement support, complimentary and expressive arts therapy, etc.

With generous funding from the Vancouver Foundation, a camp-site supplied by the Elks, and a wonderful group of volunteers, Langley Hospice's **1st Annual Camp Waterbugs, Dragonflies, & Memories** (September 1 – 3) for grieving children and teens was a huge success! During this special week-end, twenty-two children and teens and over thirty volunteers and staff members participated in healing circles, art, music, nature, fun, games and grief. The magical week-end of fun and healing ended with a butterfly release in memory of their loved ones.

Our fundraising and public awareness events were well supported by the community. The Aldergrove Safeway adopted Langley Hospice as its charity for the 2006/2007 **Safeway We Care Campaign** and several events have taken place. Over 450 people participated in the **13th Annual Celebrate a Life** at Willowbrook Mall during the holiday season. Our Christmas event, **"Something for the Holidays" Fashion Show** and silent auction provided our guests with an opportunity to purchase Christmas gifts, support Langley Hospice and have fun doing it. Even the sprinkling of rain didn't dampen the spirits of the over 125 participants who joined us for the **7th Annual Journey Walk/Run for Remembrance** at the George Preston Recreation Centre.

Second Story Treasures Hospice Thrift Store continues to be a community endeavor and we make every effort to follow our motto of "reduce, reuse, recycle and rethink". Revenue from the Thrift Store has increased from 25% to 34% which is a very significant 9%. All proceeds go directly to support hospice programs and services, which are offered free of charge to the community. Special thanks to the volunteers, staff, donors and customers!

Our **Bereavement Support Programs** are a vital part of the continuum of support provided by Langley Hospice because it acknowledges that hospice care does not end with the physical death of the client. In addition to our loss support groups for adults, teens and children, and one-to-one volunteer/staff support, we have added a clinical counseling component for people experiencing traumatic grief. We still maintain the hospice philosophy that grief is a normal process for most people, however, research has shown that between 15 – 30 percent of bereaved people experience complicated grief requiring clinical counseling support. Thus, we are pleased to announce the addition of a registered clinical counselor to our staff.

We continue to work in partnership with Fraser Health to support the Langley Hospice Residence both financially and through our **Palliative Client Volunteer Program**. Our volunteers are an integral part of the care team and cover shifts from 9:00 am to 9:00 pm on most days and provide emotional and practical support to patients and their families. Over the past year, the Hospice Residence has been home to 180 clients, the majority of whom we have supported.

This past year we have paid particular attention to strengthening our very important **Volunteer Development Program**. Volunteers are the lifeblood of our organization. We created the position of volunteer coordinator whose role is to actively recruit, coordinate and recognize volunteers. When we add all our volunteer activities; including client, thrift store, office, event, board, and newsletter volunteers, the number of hours totals 21,305. This is equivalent to over 10 people working full time! Thank-you!

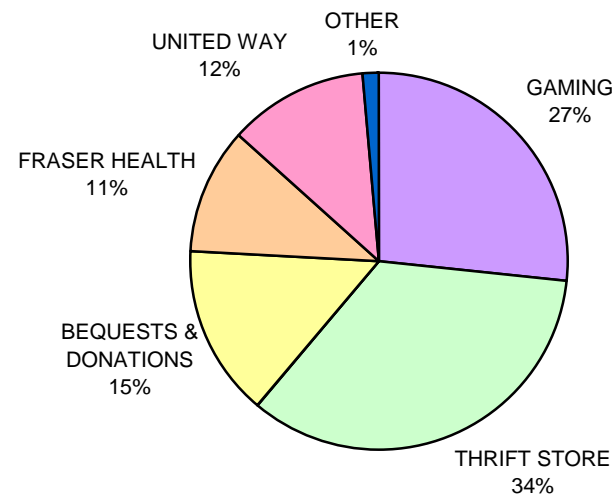


Sandra Castle presents Kathy Derksen with an award commemorating her 15-years of volunteer service to Langley Hospice.

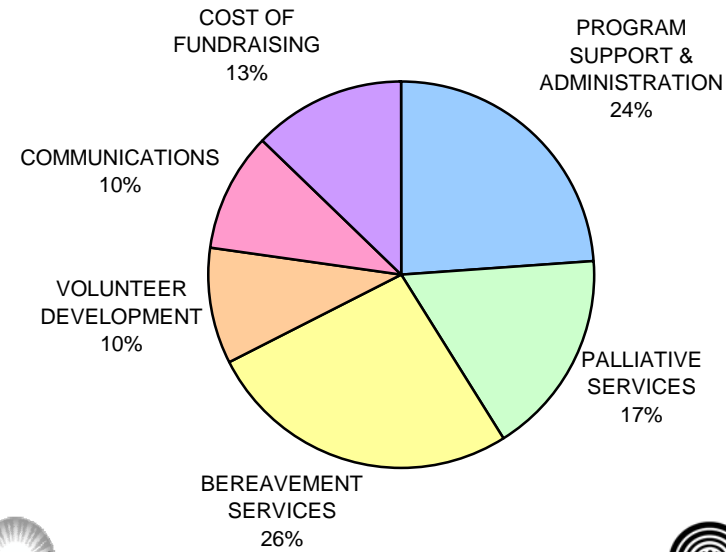
**Langley Hospice Society
